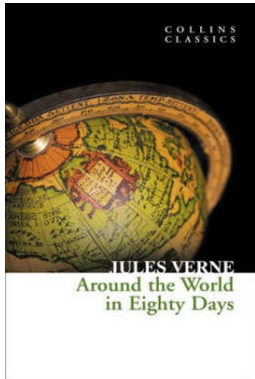
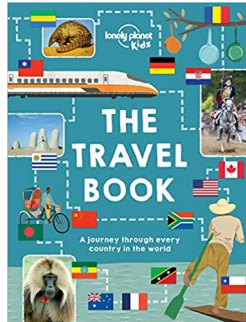

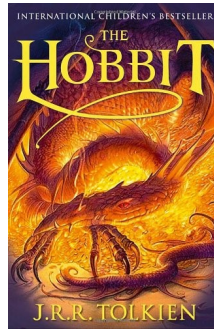

# Globe-trotters

## Homework Project

We want you to produce a **high quality** piece of work in preparation for our new topic.– Globe-trotters. We would like you to **EITHER make a 3d model a OR create a poster** based on something you find fascinating from around the world (please see below for ideas). You should look at any **one** of the following – **Egypt, India, Hong Kong, Japan, or USA.**

The following are some ideas:

- ◆ Make a model of a famous landmark for your selected country/place of visit, e.g. Taj Mahal, or the bronze Tian Tan Buddha statue.
- ◆ Create an eye-catching and vibrant poster (A4, or A3 size) about your selected country/place of visit from around the world– you should include images and facts.
- ◆ Make a model of something fascinating from your selected country/place of visit e.g. for Egypt you could make Nemes, amulets, artefacts, Egyptian Gods and Goddesses etc.

This term, Year Five will be learning about the different parts of the world. Our pupils will discuss and talk about the geographical locations of different countries/continents by using secondary resources and reading maps, or atlases. We will explore and compare different climates, rivers and mountains. Our students will look at different religious beliefs, cultures, famous landmarks and the history of different civilisations to get a better understanding of other people's lifestyle.

## Some of the questions we hope to answer this term are:

- Why is a global community important?
- What countries are in...(name a continent)?
- What impact did Ancient Egypt have on modern life?
- Who did the Ancient Egyptians worship?
- How has the world travel evolved over time?

### Can you help?

Do you have any memorable souvenirs, or artefacts we could borrow to show the class? Have you lived or worked abroad? Could you share stories of life abroad with the class? Do you have postcards from different locations across the globe? If you can help, please contact the year 5 team!
